WIZARD WORLD LOUISVILLE COMIC CON BRINGS FANS AND CELEBRITIES TO KENTUCKY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTER

LOUISVILLE, KY (October 30, 2015) – Wizards, super heroes and time travelers will be arriving in downtown Louisville Friday, Nov. 6 – Sunday, Nov. 8 for Wizard World Louisville Comic Con, bringing thousands of fans together to meet their favorite characters, artists and celebrities at the Kentucky International Convention Center.

Comic Cons, like Wizard World, gives fans of sci-fi, fantasy and genre stories a place to gather and celebrate the culture, characters and stories they love. All about the fan experience, these conventions offer a place to dress up, meet celebrities and buy merchandise.

The impressive list of celebrities coming to the Louisville event includes stars of some of the biggest sci-fi and fantasy hits. Numerous cast members from “Arrow” including star Stephen Amell, John Barrowman, who also starred in Torchwood, Katie Cassidy, David Ramsey and Paul Blackthorne. Other celebrities include Harry Potter’s Jason Isaac, Sonequa Martin-Green from “The Walking Dead” and Gotham’s Ben McKenzie. Programming scheduled throughout the event will feature comic and sci-fi discussions, question and answer sessions with almost every celebrity guest and costume contests for both adults and children.

In addition, artists at the event will showcase and sell original artwork. Many well-known comic book artists will be on hand, including Billy Martin who illustrated “TMNT New Animated Adventures,” Phil Oritz who drew for “The Simpsons,” Tom Cook who worked on “He-Man,” James O’Barr who worked on “The Crow”, and more.

In addition, all full-price Wizard World Comic Con Louisville attendees will receive a limited edition cover of “The Walking Dead” comic, drawn by one of Wizard World’s talented guest artists. Comics will be issued at registration while supplies last.

Tickets can be purchased for individual days or as a weekend pass. Tickets are \$39.95 for Friday, \$49.95 for Saturday and \$ 44.95 for Sunday in advance. Ticket prices increase \$10 at the door. Weekend passes are \$79.95 in advance and \$90 at the door. Meet and greets with celebrities are purchased separately.

Show hours are Friday 3 p.m. – 8 p.m., Saturday 10 a.m. – 7 p.m. and Sunday 11 a.m. – 5 p.m.
